Year!

- Retell stories.
- Begin to understand and ask how and why questions.
- Use talk to organise and sequence thoughts and ideas.in well-formed sentences.
- Connect one idea or action to another using a range of connectives.
- Learn and use new vocabulary (look out on our weekly diary slips).

Maths

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- Subitise to 5 (see how many without counting).
- Develop mental math skills including:
 - Count to 20 and beyond.
 - 1 more / 1 less than a number.
 Recall number bonds to 5 (e.g. 1+1=2, 0+2=3, 2+0=2).
 - Recall subtraction facts to 5 (e.g 3-2=1, 3-1=2,3-3=0,3-0=3).
 - Link numerals to amounts.
 - Talk about numbers to 5. Talk about how they can be made, reasoning and explaining our thinking.

Expressive Arts and Design

* Develop drawing skills, thinking about shape, space and proportion.

- * Talk about different textures and use different collage materials to
- represent features.
- * Retell and act out storylines and narratives in our play.
- * Sing songs in a group or alone.
- * Engage in music making using a range of instruments.
- * Explore pitch in singing and playing instruments.

Physical Development

- Bat and ball skills rolling and catching., passing, tapping, stopping, hitting, throwing.
- Develop control, coordination, balance and agility in large scale movements – running, jumping, skipping, climbing.
- Use a pencil and hold it effectively to form letters correctly.
- Develop small motor skills to handle tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control.

Literacy

- Link letters to sounds in writing.
- Segment and blend sounds together in simple words and know which letters represent them.
- Write labels, captions, phrases and sentences. .
- Begin to break the flow of speech into words.
- Read a simple sentence including tricky words.

What will we be doing?

- We will be learning about farm animals, and using information books to find out farm animal facts.
- We will be leaning how to retell the story of The Three Little Pigs and The Three Billy Goats Gruff using story actions.
 - We will use our phonic knowledge to write letter sounds, words and sentences to retell the stories we read and farm animal facts.
 - In our role play area we can retell The 3 Little pigs, exploring building the houses for the pigs!
 - We will be learning to model with clay clay farm animals.
 - We will be using different collage materials to represent part of the 3 pigs story.
