Throughout March—Share a Million Stories Campaign

We will be taking part in the share a story campaign aiming to reach the goal of one million stories shared across the UK and Ireland during World Book Day month. The challenge is to read for a minimum of 10 minutes a day, sharing a story with someone. If you share a story as a family, don't forget to count every person that was part of sharing it! All pupils will be given a story reading record to complete and we will keep a running total of how many stories we have read as a whole school on a weekly basis. In school, we will also be keeping a record of how many stories are shared in each class. Story reading records will be sent home at the start of World Book Day week.
