Swimming for all children (reception to year 4) Includes transport, badges, certificates and first aid training.	Children, teachers, tas etc.		All children in reception to year 4 will be given swimming lessons. Reception - to year 4 will go to Woodrow pool (run by sholfins) A lot of our children do not have swimming lessons out of school so we have a lot of non-swimmers. Parents will pay for the lessons but transport, awards and swimming teachers will be subsidised through school. Covid has had a massive impact on swimming for children with many of our children never being in a pool. Children benefited from small group swimming lessons closely tailored to their needs, increased skill development and confidence. Continue with this next year with all children being offered lessons.	£6006.54

Encourage all children to drink water throughout the day - promote healthy lifestyles. All children have a bottle which are kept in school.
